Weekly Spelling Practice

We really appreciate your support in helping your child learn their weekly spellings. Teachers base these on rules taught within the National Curriculum and statutory words set by the DFE. Our long term aim is that children start to use these words more frequently , building a larger vocabulary as well as using them within their writing across the range of subjects taught. There are many different ways spelling can be learnt:

- Look and say and write and cover and check
- A few a day
- Breaking words down into syllables
- Make connections to spelling rules
- Put the words within sentences to add meaning
- Make connections to pictures or mnemonics.
- Have fun with words
- And many more

We would recommend that you try to set a regular time for learning these words throughout the week so that children can repeatedly practise spellings and that this can be transferred into their long term memory.

Attendance and Holiday Absence

There have been some major changes to our school attendance policy this year and over the past couple of weeks we have flagged our new policy in our weekly newsletter. Some of the main changes are linked to what school can authorise and term time holidays.

Key changes include:

- A new term time absence form instead of emailing the office.
- A tougher Government stance on term time absences
- Increased fixed penalty notices
- Tougher action for families who take regular term time holidays.

Walking and Cycling to School

Walking, cycling and scooting are great ways to travel to school, particularly when adults walk with their child. As the children grow older some parents request that children walk to school on their own — we would recommend that children are too young to do this until the summer term of Year 4.

Similarly, some families scoot and cycle with their parents. We politely request that children do not cycle to school until they have passed their Bikeability training which usually takes place in the summer term of Year 5. Whilst we believe that it is important that children are given increasing responsibility as they grow older, cycling to school on the roads can be very dangerous if children have not received the appropriate training.
