#### Maths

In maths this term we will complete our focus area of fractions, decimals and percentages. We then build on our Year 4 understanding of statistics.

## **English**

The children completed some wonderful writing last term developing and practising skills based on story openings and characterisation, writing fables along with non-chronological reports. This term, they will have the opportunity to put their learning of each of these genres into practice.

It remains extremely important that your child is reading regularly at home. As part of their homework in Year 5, children need to continue to read at least twice a week with an adult at home. Please initial reading records, these will continue to be collected each Wednesday. In addition, children will continue with a reading comprehension task each week as part of their homework.

## Homework

Homework will be set on a Thursday and should be handed in by the following Tuesday. A weekly spelling test will take place each Thursday morning. Our half term 40 word spelling test will take place on **Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> April**.

Times tables and division facts will continue to be tested on Wednesdays.
